

No Convoys The Road to Collisions

Back to Course Play audio

Travelling in convoy is common amongst drivers who work for the same company, work for the same customer or that are travelling to the same destination as other drivers. It feels more sociable to drive together. However, convoy driving is full of danger for you, other drivers, pedestrians and cyclists.

We all know people die in road collisions because they knowingly or unwittingly do something that is risky or dangerous. A serious collision can put you at risk of death, significant injury, loss of licence or prison. What about the impact on your family, someone else's family, your job and your company? In a collision, the difference between a death and escaping unharmed can be just inches.


In this Toolbox Talk we look at the risks associated with tailgating and its consequences, plus some techniques to avoid convoy driving.

Learning Point: The risk in convoy

It is the policy of your company that any vehicles driven on company business shall not travel in convoy.

Learning Point: Are you 'invisible'?

Travelling in convoy increases the risk of two or more vehicles being involved in a collision caused by tailgating.

Learning Point: Take control

Take control, travel with a clear space in front of you so you can see what is going on and have plenty of time to react.



Company policy on travelling in convoy states that...

- Drivers can travel in convoy if they are going to the same destination
- Drivers can travel in convoy if one of them does not know the route

No drivers shall travel in convoy

Driving in a convoy...

- Is unavoidable on motorways
- Is not safe at all**
- Is safe on wide single carriageway roads

Driving in a convoy...

- Is OK in a built-up area as speeds are slower
- Raises the risk to vulnerable road users**
- Increases the risk to the driver behind


